The book is provisionally titled: *English Language Teaching and Learning: Explorations in the Online Realm*. Articles should preferably focus on, but are by no means limited to:

- Teaching and learning online

- Blended learning practices
- Learner autonomy in an online context
- E-moderation of online activities and programs
- Intercultural aspects in online education and interaction
- Online teacher education
- Educational web tools and technologies for teachers



There is a great deal of innovative pedagogical exploration addressing the various facets and practices of online teaching and learning in English language contexts. It is very important that you follow the guidelines outlined below:

- o **Please include on the first page your name, institutional affiliation, email address(es), a (approximate) 150-word abstract and a 100-word biography.**
- o **Chapter articles should ideally be between 3000-5000 words excluding references (longer works will also be considered).**
- o **Articles should be typed using Times New Roman, font size 12, with 1 ½ line spacing.**
- o **If you include Tables and/or Figures, make sure they are no wider than 10 cms.**
- o **Do not use color in Tables or Figures.**
- o **Do not use footnotes or endnotes.**
- o **Do not indent new paragraphs. Use a space between paragraphs.**
- o **Only use 'portrait' orientation – i.e. don't insert any pages in 'landscape' orientation.**
- o **Remove all hyperlinks.**
- o **Authors should reference direct-quoted or paraphrased material (including citing page numbers).**
- o **Include a complete list of references using APA style as outlined in the *Publications Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 5th edition (2001/2003).**
- o **Send articles electronically as an (all Word formats are acceptable) attachment.**
- o **Please include your family name in the file name, e.g. [SMITH- Online technology and the Language Classroom.doc], to assist us in tracking papers.**
